

REGISTER TO VOTE OR UPDATE YOUR CURRENT REGISTRATION

If you have moved into Tehama County and are ready to register to vote, welcome to elections in Tehama County! Registering to vote takes just a few moments and allows you to participate in one of the most important rights we have as a U.S. Citizen – having your voice be heard. Register today!

If you are already a registered voter in Tehama County and need to update your registration for the following reasons:

- Moved within the County
- Changed your name
- Changed your mailing address
- Want to change your political party

You need to re-register to vote, this only takes a few minutes of your time. You may now register to vote online using one of the online voter registration tools below:

- California Secretary of State
- Rock the Vote

You will be asked to provide your driver's license number and the last four digits of your social security number. Make sure to complete all required fields correctly. Please allow a minimum of 48 hours for online applications to be processed. Registration is not instant and required individual review.

You may also pick up a voter registration card at all post offices, libraries, city offices, chamber of commerce's and the Elections office. Or call our office at 530-527-8190 and request that a card be mailed to you.

Information on your voter registration affidavit will be used by elections officials to send you official information on the voting process, such as the location of your polling place and the issues and candidates that will appear on the ballot.

Commercial use of voter registration information is prohibited by law and is a misdemeanor.

Voter information may be provided to a candidate for office, a ballot measure committee, or other persons for election, scholarly, journalistic, political, or governmental purposes, as determined by the Secretary of State. Driver's license and social security numbers, or your signature as shown on your voter registration card, cannot be released for these purposes.
