SAFETY TIPS

Compact fluorescent light bulbs (CFLs) are fragile and contain mercury, so pack them carefully to prevent breakage.

If packing more than one CFL use protective padding such as paper towels or newspaper. Do not place any other items in the same container.

IF A CFL BREAKS, FOLLOW THESE EPA GUIDELINES:

Clear the area of people and pets, turn off the central air conditioning/heater, and open windows and doors to the outside to ventilate the room for at least 5-10 minutes.

Wear rubber gloves and scoop up glass fragments and powder using stiff paper or cardboard – **don't vacuum**. Use tape to pick up remaining glass fragments and powder. Use a wet paper towel to clean hard surfaces. Place the bulb debris and cleanup materials in a plastic zipper bag, glass jar with metal lid, or other sealable container.

Dispose at your local Household Hazardous Waste event. If you can't make it to an event right away, store in a protected area away from kids and pets.
