DID YOU KNOW?

In 2018, the average person in Tehama County **produced 5 pounds of waste per day**. While the amount each day does not seem that great, for one year that means 1,825 pounds of waste were put in our landfill from just one person! If we multiply that by our total population in Tehama County, **we're burying over 116 Million pounds of waste**. While a portion of that waste is legitimate garbage, some of it could have been recycled or composted instead of being buried forever. Here are some simple tips for reducing how much you put in your garbage can:

- The best way to reduce waste is to not produce it in the first place. Replacing single-use water bottles with a **reusable water bottle** or purchasing items in bulk is a great way to eliminate the waste from packaging.
- Plastic, metal, glass, paper and cardboard are almost always recyclable. If they are **clean, dry, and empty** then they will certainly be recycled when put in your recycling cart.
- Yard waste, tree prunings, and leaves can be **composted**. When put in your yard waste cart they are sent to Compost Solutions in Orland.
- Clothing and other garments not suitable for donation can be brought to the Tehama County/Red Bluff Landfill **FREE of charge** to be recycled. Other large or bulky recyclables that do not fit in your recycling cart can also be brought to the landfill for free.
- Redeeming your **CRV beverage containers for cash** is another way to keep that material out of the landfill and keep money in your pocket.
