DID YOU KNOW?

With schools starting again soon it is **important to continue your waste reduction practices** whether the classroom is at the school building or in your living room. While the beginning of this school year will look a lot different than previous years there are still **plenty of ways to reduce waste** while maintaining a healthy learning environment. Below are some tips to encourage a less wasteful school year and beyond.

- **Repair and reuse** binders, notebooks, pens, backpacks, etc. Also, consider **repairing electronic devices** before buying new ones.
- If you need new supplies **buy wisely and buy recycled content** notebooks, paper, pens, etc. Purchasing **refurbished electronic devices** is also a good way to prevent waste from occurring and save money too.
- **Manage your batteries properly** and **DO NOT** throw them in the trash! If batteries cannot be taken out of the device, the device and battery must be recycled together as electronic waste.
- While the school lunch times may be different, if packing a lunch for your child **consider going “zero waste”** by putting sandwiches, fruits and veggies in reusable containers instead of plastic bags and using a thermos or **reusable bottle** instead of disposable juice pouches.
- Encouraging your children to **take care of their belongings** so that they last for more than one school year is another way to keep waste from ending up in the landfill.

By practicing the tips listed above we can have a healthy, safe and waste-free school year in Tehama County. Expanding on these practices to other activities in your life will also lead to a waste-free lifestyle that helps keep Tehama County beautiful.
