DID YOU KNOW?

Summertime is here and that means outdoor recreation. Many of us will be taking trips to the lake for a BBQ or maybe even heading out for a fun-filled camping vacation. When the fun times come to an end, and we have to head home, we ask ourselves, "What do we do with our empty 1 pound **disposable propane cylinders**?" Here are some things to consider when trying to resolve this dilemma:

- Do Not Throw Your Used Propane Cylinders In The Trash! Empty cylinders are often disposed of improperly in landfills, dumpsters, household trash, campsites, on the roadside or in recycling containers. When "empty," <u>disposable cylinders</u> <u>often still contain a small amount of gas, posing a danger to</u> <u>sanitation and parks workers due to the risk of explosions and</u> <u>resulting fires.</u>
- Recycle Your Empty Propane Cylinders at a <u>Household Hazardous</u> <u>Waste Facility</u>. There are several locations throughout Tehama County where you can take your empty disposable propane cylinders to be properly recycled at <u>no charge for residents</u>.
- Use Refillable Propane Cylinders. <u>Refillables save money and hassle because you only pay for the gas</u> <u>and filling service</u>, not the container. Refillables can last up to 12 years and can be refilled hundreds of times. Refillables reduce the impact on our Landfill, as well. BEVERAGE CONTAINER RECYCLING... DONE RIGHT

No matter how you recycle, the County thanks you for your efforts. Here are two tips to maximize your recycling efforts the next time you finish a refreshing, cold beverage:

- Take your aluminum, glass, and plasic beverage containers to your local recycling center for a <u>cash refund</u> (5 ¢ for containers less than 24 oz. and 10 ¢ for containers 24 oz. or larger).
- Toss your rinsed beverage containers into your <u>blue curbside</u> <u>recycling cart</u> with your other recyclables.
