DID YOU KNOW?

Recycling yard waste – or composting – has many benefits for your yard and garden. Here are a few tips:

Consider grasscycling!

Use a mulching mower or retrofit your current mower with a mulching

blade kit and let grass clippings fall back into the lawn. This adds nitrogen from the clippings to the soil, naturally reducing the need for chemical fertilizers.

Shredded leaves and grass clippings make great mulch.

Not only does mulch return nutrients to the soil, but it helps control weeds, conserve moisture and reduce soil erosion.

Backyard composting is easier than you think.

It's relatively easy to <u>make your own composting pile</u>, or you can purchase a composting bin.
