DID YOU KNOW?

Did you know that recycling **paper literally outweighs** most other forms of recycling combined? In fact, by weight, **more paper is recovered for recycling from municipal solid waste streams than glass, plastic, steel and aluminum combined**. Pretty impressive, huh? Furthermore, did you know that recycling 2,000 pounds of paper can save 17 trees, 7,000 gallons of water, 380 gallons of oil, 3.3 cubic yards of landfill

Unfortunately, not all paper is recyclable. Here's a guide to help you distinguish between paper you can put in your recycling bin and paper you can't:

- ⇒ **Recyclable:** white or colored paper (may contain staples, sticky notes and paper clips); newspapers; magazines and catalogs; phone books; envelopes (metal brackets and plastic windows okay); junk mail; and cardboard (please flatten).
- ⇒ Not Recyclable: paper plates or cups that contain food residue; Styrofoam; paper which contains large quantities of glue or tape; laminated paper; frozen food; microwaveable or juice concentrate containers.

Last year Tehama County residents recycled 2,200,000 pounds of paper. Great Job! Let's keep it going.
