DID YOU KNOW?

Junk mail is like your least favorite relatives around the holidays: It just keeps showing up year after year even if you wish it would go away. **In Tehama County the average household receives approximately 850 pieces of “Junk Mail” every year.** That adds up to 20,037,050 pieces annually throughout the county. If junk mail is cluttering your mailbox and your life, the best thing you can do is **remove your name from mailing lists** so you do not receive it at all. However, even the best services will not stop every piece of junk mail, which means you need to find a good way to recycle whatever you end up getting. The good news is that all junk mail is made of paper, which is a staple for recycling programs.

Letters, flyers and numerous other items come to you printed on regular old paper. It is fine to place it in your recycling bin. There are a couple cases where you should not just toss junk mail straight in your bin, however. If a junk mail item contains **plastic (such as fake credit cards) or sheets of return address labels,** open the envelope and remove those items. They will need to be separated.

What about the windows in my junk mail envelopes?

Good news, those are recyclable too! Separate the window from the envelope before placing in the recycling.
