DID YOU KNOW?

Not all plastics can be recycled. These types of plastic are called “**single-use**” **plastics** and can be found in everything from food packaging to medical devices. When single-use plastics end up in the recycling stream they become **contaminants** that could lead to a whole bale of recycled plastic being rejected from the recycling manufacturing facility. Single-use plastics are also **lightweight** and, when carelessly discarded, they tend to wind up in our waterways and on our beaches, **endangering wildlife** and blemishing these beautiful spaces. While some single-use plastics are impossible to avoid, like medical IV bags, here are a few **tips for reducing** your use of these plastics and managing the ones that cannot be reduced.

- Use **reusable containers** instead of sandwich bags. They keep your sandwich from being squished and will pay for themselves after a few uses.
- **Purchase goods in bulk**, using your reusable containers (if possible) to avoid most of the single-use plastics that nuts, grains and other foods are often packaged in.
- Ask your local restaurant if you can **use your own reusable containers for takeout** instead of the Styrofoam food containers most restaurants use.
- Bring your own **reusable mesh bags for produce** when shopping at grocery stores and farmers’ markets to avoid using the thin plastic bags.
- If a single-use plastic item cannot be avoided ensure that it is placed in the trash. **Bagging your trash** before it gets picked up helps to keep these lightweight plastics from escaping your trash cart when the garbage truck picks it up.
- Also, if you are self-hauling waste to the Tehama County/Red Bluff Landfill, make sure you **tarped your load** to keep our roadways clean.

When purchasing products in plastic packaging always try to find packaging that can be **recycled**, or even better, **reused**. By practicing the tips above we can reduce our use of plastics that cannot be recycled, thereby improving the habitat for wildlife and keeping our beautiful spaces in Tehama County clean.
