DID YOU KNOW?

As the weather starts to warm, many Tehama County residents will begin to prepare for the upcoming pool season. As most pool owners will tell you, it takes a fair amount of maintenance and pool chemicals to keep a pool functioning properly. As seasons pass, a collection of old or unused chemicals inevitably begins to form, and is usually forgotten. Here are some tips to help you clear up some space and make your home safer all at the same time:

- **Always practice proper chemical storage and never attempt to mix chemicals - even if it saves space.** Certain chemicals may react negatively with others, so avoid any potential safety hazards and **keep chemicals separated.** Remember - it's always best to use the pool chemicals as they were intended.
- If you don't need chemicals anymore, **offer them to fellow pool owners (be sure they are properly labeled and not past their expiration).**
- If the chemicals have outlived their useful lives, **they must be taken to a Household Hazardous Waste (HHW) facility for proper disposal.** Visit www.tehamacountylandfill.com for facility locations and a list of **FREE** collection events for Tehama County residents (small fees apply to businesses).
