DID YOU KNOW?

Refrigerators and freezers contain refrigerants, oils, and other compounds that, **by federal law, must be removed and recovered**. Then the metals and other materials can be recycled. But how much material does that really generate? **Check out these quick facts:**

- Around 9 million refrigerators and freezers are thrown out in the U.S. every year. **In 2016 the Tehama County landfill received 879 refrigerators and freezers for disposal.**
- Around 90% of refrigerators will end up in some type of recycling program, but the ultimate fate of all the bits and pieces that make up a refrigerator will depend on how it is recycled.
- An average refrigerator contains around 120lbs of recyclable steel. At the Tehama County/Red Bluff Landfill, refrigerators are sent out for metal recycling.
- Major home appliances make up about 10% of the steel processed by the recycling industry each year.
- Refrigerators also contain other recyclable materials, including aluminum, copper, CFC refrigerants and some plastics.

So what should I do with my refrigerator?

- Some metal recycling businesses will accept refrigerators for a small fee or for free.
- If the refrigerator or freezer still works, donate it to a charity or sell it to a used appliance store.
- The Tehama County/Red Bluff Landfill accepts refrigerators for a fee.

BEVERAGE CONTAINER RECYCLING... DONE RIGHT

No matter how you recycle, the County thanks you for your efforts. Here's a tip to maximize your recycling efforts the next time you finish a refreshing, cold beverage:

- Take your aluminum, glass and plastic beverage containers to your local recycling center for a **cash refund** (5 ¢ for containers less than 24 oz. and 10 ¢ for containers 24 oz. or larger).
- Toss your rinsed beverage containers into your **blue curbside recycling cart** with your other recyclables.
