DID YOU KNOW?

A common question asked of us here at the Tehama County Solid Waste Management Agency is "Why is it necessary to recycle televisions?" This is a great question. It's important to recycle TV sets properly because many older sets contain up to <u>8 pounds of lead</u> in addition to plenty of other potentially hazardous materials such as mercury, cadmium and chromium to name a few. Many of the newer flat screen televisions contain multiple hazardous materials and heavy metals as well. When you consider that an estimated **16,000 televisions** will be purchased in Tehama County this year alone and approximately **4,200 more will be discarded** you can certainly understand the importance of recycling your television. So, how can you recycle your television?

Here are a few options:

- 1) Before you discard it, see if you can <u>donate your working television</u> to a charity, school, church or community group.
- 2) Some retailers will take back your old TV for free -- regardless of where you bought it. Just ask.
- **3)** E-waste recycling events are a great way to free yourself of unwanted televisions at no charge.
