DID YOU KNOW?

With the restrictions on large gatherings making people change their summer plans, remember that **recycling and reducing the waste we send**

to the landfill is just as important as ever. The concerns over spreading coronavirus may be changing how you plan your summer barbeques and other outdoor gatherings with friends and family. While these gatherings tend to create larger amounts of waste, the Tehama County Solid Waste Management Agency has some tips to **help lower your impact to the environment and keep everyone safe and healthy.**



- If using disposable items try purchasing ones made with **recycled content**, and rinse and recycle plastic cups and utensils.
- Having a handwashing station is a good idea to keep the germs away. Use **unbleached paper towels with recycled content fibers** that can then be **composted**.
- Purchase inexpensive reusable containers or **save yogurt and sour cream containers** that can be used as **“to-go plates”** for guests. That way, you do not need to worry about getting the containers back.
- When the party is over (and all the cans and bottles are **clean, dry, and empty**) take them to a CRV redemption center near you to get the money for them.
- Remember to **safely store any unused fireworks** or bring them to a household hazardous waste collection event (listed above) to properly dispose of them. **Unused fireworks should never go in the trash or recycling bin.**
