DID YOU KNOW?

Thanksgiving is a great time to be thankful, and appreciate who you have and what you have. It is a time for families to meet, socialize and enjoy each other's company - sometimes the only opportunity in a year. For the sake of simplicity, many of us will choose to use paper products such as paper plates and cups for the big feast. While this may be a convenient and, albeit easy, approach to the day, it leaves us with a few questions such as "What do I do with the used paper products?", "Can these items be recycled?" and "Is there a better more practical idea?"

Here are some facts that you may not be aware of:

- 1)** Although these items are paper, these items are **NOT** recyclable. Often times these items are soiled with food or other contaminants, which causes problems in the paper making process and therefore must be placed in the trash, taking up precious space in our Landfill.
- 2)** Many paper products have a thin petroleum plastic lining to give strength to the product and prevent leaking. This petroleum plastic lining is considered a contaminant in the composting process, so they cannot be composted.
- 3)** The Tehama County Solid Waste Management Agency offers reusable dishes and flatware to borrow for your parties and social gatherings that can service **up to 50 people**. Contact the Agency at the number below for more info.
