The elections official shall not cause to be printed or circulated any statement which the elections official determines is not so limited or which includes any such references. (E.C. Sec. 13308)

CANDIDATE'S <u>OWN</u> QUALIFICATIONS	Court Decision Prohibits Any Reference to Opponents All prospective candidates should be aware of the Court of Appeals ruling in the recent court case of Dean v. Superior Court. The 1998 decision analyzed California Elections Code section 13307, the statute governing the content of a candidate's statement for local office. The Court of Appeals concluded that the statement prepared by a candidate for inclusion in a voter's pamphlet may include comments on one's own qualifications, but may not include comments on one's opponents' qualifications, or lack thereof.
	"The Dean Decision is clear Candidates are not to refer to their opponents in any manner in the candidate's statement."
	All candidates should confine their voter pamphlet statement to a listing of their particular qualifications and pertinent biographical information.
	Importantly, persons seeking office that use the candidate's statement as a forum for attacking an opponent are subject to legal action by the opponent. The opponent can request that the court strike all improper content in a candidate's statement. If successful in this effort, the candidate can request and the court can order the losing candidate to pay the attorney's fee and costs incurred by the opponent in challenging the candidate's non-conforming statement. Accordingly, it is in each candidate's best interest to use his or her allotted words wisely and within the permissible scope of Elections Code section 13307.
	Prospective candidates are solely responsible for preparation and submittal of candidate's statements that are in conformance with Elections Code section 13307 and other pertinent provisions of the California Elections Code. The Registrar of Voters and its employees and agents do not have the legal authority to reject of modify candidate statements containing improper content. Challenges to written material in a voter's pamphlet are governed by Elections Code section 13313, which authorizes the <u>courts</u> to amend or delete false, misleading of inconsistent material.
